






Figure 3. Typical Saturation Voltage Characteristics




Figure 5. Saturation Voltage vs. Case
Temperature at Variant Current Level




Figure 2. Typical Output Characteristics




Figure 4. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 6. Saturation Voltage vs. V_{GE}




Figure 7. Saturation Voltage vs. V_{GE}




Figure 9. Capacitance Characteristics




Figure 11. SOA Characteristics




Figure 8. Saturation Voltage vs. V_{GE}




Figure 10. Gate charge Characteristics




Figure 12. Turn-on Characteristics vs.
Gate Resistance




Figure 13. Turn-off Characteristics vs.
Gate Resistance




Figure 14. Turn-on Characteristics vs. Collector Current




Figure 15. Turn-off Characteristics vs. Collector Current




Figure 16. Switching Loss vs. Gate Resistance




Figure 17. Switching Loss vs. Collector Current




Figure 18. Turn off Switching SOA Characteristics




Figure 19. Forward Characteristics




Figure 20. Typical Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage




Figure 21. Stored Charge




Figure 22. Reverse Recovery Time







Figure 23.Transient Thermal Impedance of IGBT
